## Remarks by the Senior Serving Hussar Major General Mike Ward

The Chief of the Defence Staff's Number 1 Priority is Operations. 8<sup>th</sup> Hussars can take great pride and satisfaction that we are fully supporting that objective, not just through service in Afghanistan, but also by all those that are helping train the troops for their upcoming deployments. I visited Joint Task Force Afghanistan in May 2007. From the Sabretache, I knew that Hussars were there, and I wanted to meet with them and find out how they were doing. Easier said than done. Nevertheless, while in Kandahar, having repeatedly and unsuccessfully tried to track Major Korth and WOs Zinck and White, I did manage to catch Padre Malcolm Berry and to have dinner one particularly memorable Afghan evening with Master Corporal LeBlanc and Corporals Black and Publicover in the Provincial Reconstruction Team in Kandahar City. Through them I got a sense for how well they were doing in their mission to help Afghans, how well they had integrated into the PRT and the Battle Group, and for how well the Regiment had helped to prepare them for the mission. I was particularly impressed at their confidence in their skills and that of

their teams and in the confidence that their PRT RSM had in them. We are definitely on the right track when we can develop fine soldiers like these who wear our badge with such pride.

It was a great pleasure to escape Ottawa for the Change of Command between LCol Scott Craft and LCol Paul Nielsen in late September. In the last three years the Regiment has seen some tremendous changes. Changing from a tank to a reconnaissance role, embarking on an aggressive recruiting campaign and concentrating especially on officer and NCO development LCol Craft has worked extremely hard to set the conditions for success in the future. The Change of Command Mixed Dining-In was a great chance for me to meet the officers, WOs and Sgts and to learn how well the leadership of the Regiment is carrying out its duties. It is clear to me that we have a dedicated team in place who have benefited from LCol Craft's strong and sensible leadership. On behalf of the greater Regimental family and Regimental Council I want to thank you, Scott, for how you have upheld the quality and reputation of the Regiment and wish you well as you move on to join the Advanced Training cell at Area HQ.

LCol Nielsen has assumed command extremely well qualified for the job. A former Officer Commanding C Squadron in Germany, Tactics and Armour School Instructor in Gagetown, 37 Brigade G3 Operations and Regimental Second in Command in Moncton, he has earned his spurs. Regimental Council has complete confidence in your abilities, Paul, and commits to supporting you fully as you lead the 8<sup>th</sup> Hussars through the next few years. Many challenges await, but they are the best kind, training for and deploying troops to operations, and building on the reputation and accomplishments of Hussars who have gone before.

I would be remiss if I did not salute LCol Bob MacLeod, wartime veteran, former Commanding Officer, and a pillar of our Regimental Association who passed away in September. I want to also convey my condolences to the family of Trooper Scott who was killed in a car accident just weeks ago. It is at times like these that we must rally around as a Regimental family and continue to look after our own.

### ASSOCIATION PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

**T**he past year, since I assumed the position of Association President has been very busy and I must admit that some days I wondered if I possibly could get everything finished on time and in the mail. From Revenue Canada reports, to condolences, to Corporate Affairs updates, to begging Shirley LaMontagne and Brenda Coleman to do more to help out, and the list goes on. So the learning curve has been very steep.

In looking back on the past year, I feel that it has been fairly successful. We have forged, in a small way, a plan to revitalize the Association and to move forward into the foreseeable future, but I must caution all of our membership, this will only be as successful as each of us makes it. Whether it is buying a 50/50 ticket or volunteering to send a card to someone, it all contributes to the overall success of the Association and without all our many members contributing we are going to experience difficulties in the future.

I would like to go over some of the past years initiatives so that all of our membership is aware of what your Executive have been doing. The first step was to expand the Executive to include members outside the immediate area of

Sussex and the original home of the Regiment. This has been very successful with two members of the Executive coming from Ontario and they have been actively involved in every meeting via teleconferencing services and follow-up emails.

At the recommendation of the Executive we developed an Association presentation, which focused on our way ahead, and I presented this at a number of venues including, Oromocto, Hampton, and Petawawa. This presentation focused on the issues confronting the Association, from lack of active membership, outdated constitution and by-laws to finances and the lack thereof. To complement this outreach, the Executive developed some action plans and to date, we feel we have achieved about 50% of our goals.

We conducted a reasonably successful fundraiser through our 50/50 draw, which realized about \$1300 for the General Fund. An additional \$1000 was earned through the hard work of a few individuals who parked cars at the Sussex Balloon Fiesta and the annual Flea Market, namely Borden McLellan, Casey Van Den Heuvel, Bill Nickson, Darren Spicer, Diane Lutes and other support from the local Cadet Corps associated with the Regiment.

These two fund raisers are sponsored by the Association and the funds raised go primarily for the support of the Sussex Cadet Corp and to a lesser extent, the Moncton, Dieppe, and Port Elgin Corp, all of which wear the Hussar hat badge. However the Hussar Museum is also greatly assisted with funds as well. Other issues with funds revolved around establishing and protecting our funds committed to the 175th Anniversary celebration. This initiative was confirmed by a unanimous vote at the AGM in September and will be finalized in the near future through our investment portfolio advisor. By separating out this fund, it allows the Executive to better manage and make use of earnings on the rest of the investment portfolio on an annual basis.

The secretary Shirley LaMontagne, made a great effort to validate and update the complete membership list of the Association. Hundreds of phone calls and emails on her part have been successful in getting it to about a 75% ready state. However it will be a work in progress for a while and will also need the support of the membership at large to ensure we are notified of address changes and notification of members who have passed away.

Due to a number of individuals, especially Frank Smith and Scovil Brown, we have been much more successful in getting condolences out to deceased members' families. The Association web page and Last Post page have been in constant revision, but the work has been worthwhile in this respect, providing timely notices and acknowledging the passing of these members. Calls or emails to the secretary usually resulted in updates to the website in 1 to 2 hours. In respect to the Association web page, we do plan to do some revisions in the near future, in an effort to make it a much more effective tools for communicating and advertising the work and activities of all phases of the Association.

Thanks to the efforts of Brenda Coleman, donations from the Regiment, and other individuals, care packages were sent to all Hussars in Roto 01-07 in Afghanistan and this will be carried on for the 6 Hussars currently serving in that country in the next Roto.



The Association Reunion and AGM, held at the Sussex Legion was well attended with numbers showing a good increase over the past few years. A number of special events occurred during this event, including a tribute to the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the founding of the Regular Regiment in 1957, a dedication of the LCol George Robinson's artifacts at the Hussar Museum, and a meet and greet with two daughters of LCol Robinson who traveled from Alberta and Ontario to take part in the delivery

of his medals, sword, baton and other artifacts to the museum. Their attendance was especially important to the surviving wartime veterans and more than a few tears were shed, as the veterans and the Robinson family exchanged hugs, stories and memories of serving with their father in Italy.



Other travelers from a distance included Bob Lescombe, President of the Radley-Walters Chapter, and his wife Caroline, who traveled down from Petawawa and Ken Carhart, who just happened to drop in from England. Bob's attendance and support, as well as all the other attendees at this AGM, was greatly appreciated. The Memorial Service was conducted under cover at the Museum and was well attended by members of the Regiment and the Association alike. The Association Pipes and Drums supported this event with musical renditions and vocals for the anthems.



To top off the day, two young Hussars, MCpl Aaron LeBlanc and Cpl Darrin Publicover, spoke at the evening dinner about their experiences while serving in Afghanistan as part of Roto 01-07. By the use of photos and unblemished graphic description, they told the story everyone should hear about Afghanistan.



Future steps will now include revisions of the Constitution and efforts to firm up our financial situation. To that end we need the support of all our membership.

## COMMANDING OFFICER'S MESSAGE

I am typing this brief note exactly two months after taking command on 29 September 2007 of the finest Armour Regiment in Canada. I am honoured and humbled to be given the opportunity to command the Hussars.

The Reviewing Officer was Colonel Tony Stack, Commander 37 CBG and the Brigade RSM, CWO Brennan, joined him. The sun was shining, the temperature was perfect, and it was a great day to parade the Guidon for all Hussars. The Regiment was honoured to have Major General Mike Ward, Senior Serving Hussar take time out of his busy schedule to attend the Mixed Dining In and parade. As always his presence at any Hussar activity is welcome and I hope that he will join the Regiment at other events. Also at the parade were several former Commanding Officers and in particular the Regiments Honorary Lieutenant Colonel LCol (retired) Jack Trueman who commanded the Reserve Regiment from 1977 to 1981. Although a little bias, the Regimental Staff did a superb job preparing the Regiment for this important weekend in our history. Thanks to all who helped.

I will take a bit of your time explaining what the Regiment is doing this year with regards to training. The Regiment has been given a *no fail* mission to field a trained recce troop to join a 37 CBG force generated Combat Team which will participate in a Reserve CMTC rotation in August 2008. This troop will consist of eight crewed Light Utility Vehicles Wheeled (LUVW – Mercedes) broken down into three patrols and the troop leaders HQ patrol. The Troop Leader is Captain Shannon King and her Troop WO is Sgt Bruce Montrose. B Sqn, (commanded by Major Steve

Neily) has been tasked to train the troop but the entire Regiment will be needed to find crewman who want to commit to this excellent training opportunity. In March the troop will travel with the combat team to Fort Picket to further hone their recce skills, do a bit of live fire training, and maybe squeeze in some R&R.

A Sqn, (commanded by Capt Shane Gallant) has been tasked to organize training, for the non CMTC Troop crewmen, to practice and refresh individual soldier skills to include winter indoctrination training. During March break, A Sqn has been tasked to set up Forward Operating Base Hussar (FOB HUSSAR) in the Gagetown training area with the view of organizing exciting training for Hussars who are not at Fort Picket. (I suspect up to 30 more Hussars will deploy to Fort Picket in some support capacity). The training at FOB HUSSAR will include MILCOT conversion training, BMQ, rappelling, recovery operations, and day and night driving but to name a few activities. Overall it is my intent during the March Break for soldiers to come out and train when they are able to get time off their civilian jobs. A schedule of training activities will be published in order for our crewmen to select which days they will request time-off.

In September and October our Hussars who deployed to Afghanistan returned safely. By the time this edition of the Sabretache is printed, all those Hussars will have completed their leave and returned to normal Regimental life. For the January 2008 rotation, MCpl Barkhouse (from the Orderly Room) will deploy to Afghanistan. We all wish him the best. Finally, 12 RBC has asked the Regiment for volunteers for the September 2008 or January 2009 rotation. Several Hussars have indicated their desire

to deploy. The Regimental Staff is busy working out the details. More to follow in the next Sabretache.

Finally I would like to let all Hussars know that their Regiment is in great hands. Earlier I indicated a few of the key personnel but there are several more that need to be mentioned. The Regimental 2IC is Major John Trapé. John recently retired from the British Army and brings a wealth of armour, recce and doctrinal knowledge. The RSM is still the steadfast CWO Steve Jones. The Operations Officer is Capt Wayne Fogarty and he has WO Darryl Zinck by his side as the Operations WO. WO Gagon, who I am trying to get promoted to Lieutenant, is the Adjutant and he has WO Fullum and Sgt Riswold to help with the finances and Orderly Room respectively. The most recent addition to the Hussars Team is the newly appointed Honorary Colonel; Colonel (retired) Ted Nurse. Colonel Ted was the Commanding Officer of the Regular Regiment during the period 1981 to 1983 and he brings a wealth of knowledge and wisdom to the Regiment.

In closing I would like to say that the Regiment is strong and vibrant. There are many challenges on the horizon but I believe the Regiment is properly poised to attack the challenges with flare, vigour and style. Until next time.

## REGIMENTAL MUSEUM REPORT

**T**his has been a busy year for the Museum with attendance up by 20% to 1271 visitors from Jan to 31 August. The Board of Directors has grown to seven

strong members, and we were also fortunate to have regular press coverage throughout the summer. Special events this year included visits by Elementary and Day School classes, Cub Packs, and a Special Reception to recognize (World War II) Brigadier George Robinson's daughters and husbands, who attended the Association Reunion 15 Sept. 07.

Two very successful fund raising weekends (August and September) were spent parking cars on the Armouries property, in cooperation with 8<sup>th</sup> Hussars Army Cadet Corps and Sussex Parent Support Committee. We also received several Memorials and Donations from Association members, which we appreciate.

Grants received from the NB Heritage Branch of Wellness, Culture and Sports, and the Canadian Heritage Information Network are assisting in our history project, "CAMP SUSSEX - A

CENTURY OF SERVICE". This will include both a hard display and a multi-media presentation including pictures, maps, interviews and commentary on the history of Camp Sussex. A further grant received from Heritage New Brunswick will assist us in identifying and archiving our growing collection of historically valuable military books, papers, diaries and maps.

Preliminary discussions have begun with the Town of Sussex to investigate a more permanent home for the 8<sup>th</sup> Hussars Regimental Museum, when our current Memorandum of Understanding expires in March 2009. Much thought needs to be put into this question, and long term planning and financing will need to be seriously considered, to ensure the Museum's continuity.

In view of the numerous 8<sup>th</sup> Hussar artifacts we are being asked to receive and preserve, together with

the required administration and documentation (Provincially mandated), plus the Camp Sussex History project, we must consider engaging a staff person on a part-time basis. Our collection management, display expectations and work-load have now grown beyond the capacity of strictly volunteer workers. However a staff person will soon be a drain on our finances, so there is the challenge - what to do.

I want to thank the Museum Committee members who have worked so faithfully. Through your dedication and many hours of work, our museum has been recognized by Heritage New Brunswick as the best privately owned military museum in New Brunswick today. Thank you all.
